- Help in Pediatric ER with watching and holding babies
- Update patient's families on wait times
- Maintain confidentiality
- Provide excellent customer service and emotional support to the patient.
- Bring questions and concerns to nursing care team.

Time Commitment:

Volunteers are scheduled for 3-4 hour shifts (Sunday-Saturday, 8a-8p.) Volunteers must be able to make a six-month commitment to volunteering. A minimum of 40 hours is required prior to receiving verification of volunteer work.
